Nebraska-Omaha Favorite to Repeat in Soccer Coaches Poll

Nebraska-Omaha has been picked by league coaches to repeat as North Central Conference soccer champions in the NCC Coaches Poll released today.

Nebraska-Omaha, winners of three straight NCC titles, garnered six first-place votes with Minnesota State gaining the remaining top vote.

Last season, Nebraska-Omaha won the NCC regular-season standings with an 11-0-1 mark.

UNO advanced to the NCAA Championships and defeated Central Missouri and Washburn (on tiebreaker) before falling to Grand Valley State. It was the only loss of the season for the Mavericks.

Teams begin play on the weekend of August 23 with NCC play commencing September 8.
