UNO Captures NCC, NCAA Titles - Nebraska-Omaha won the NCAA Division II Women's Soccer championship last season with a thrilling 2-1 overtime win over Seattle Pacific. It was the Mavs' fourth straight trip to the final four and their second national title match. The Mavs are now 13-3-1 all-time in the NCAA tournament with one runner-up and two third-place trophies. Nebraska-Omaha won its second straight NCC soccer crown by posting a 11-1 NCC record in 2005. The lone blemish came in a defeat at the hands of North Dakota. It is the third regular-season title for UNO.

A Battle of Maverick Proportions - Nebraska-Omaha remained in the conference lead with a 7-0-0 mark. Minnesota State, now unbeaten in its last seven games, remains in second place with a 6-1-1 mark.Both teams will be in action on Saturday with UNO at St. Cloud State and Minnesota State hosting South Dakota. Then the two will faceoff at MSU's The Pitch at Gage Towers on Sunday. Following this weekend MSU will have only two games remaining while UNO will have three games remaining. Included in that total is when MSU visits UNO on the final day of the regular season, October 29th.

The Notebook

MINNESOTA DULUTH - UMD snapped a five match losing streak (0-3-2) with a win against Augustana on Oct. 8...All eight wins in 2006 have been by shutouts and the Bulldogs have not won a match when giving up a goal...UMD's four wins is its best NCC performance since the Bulldogs joined in 2004.

SOUTH DAKOTA - The Coyotes became just the third team to score a goal on #1 Nebraska-Omaha this season when senior forward Tina Brummer posted her sixth of the season late in the game on Sunday...USD also fired 11 shots against the Mavericks, which was the highest total by a UNO opponent this season...South Dakota begins a four-game road trip this week before returning to the USD Soccer Field to close out the regular season with two home tilts.
